

- An increase in Parks and reserves maintenance from \$6,192,918 to \$6,329,312



Rating Issues

Council has resolved to maintain the current rating structure, which prevailed during 2011/2012. This rating structure utilised both base amounts and ad-valorem rates in the dollar levied on land value for rating categories Residential, Farmland and Business.

The total ordinary rate yield for 2012/2013 has been calculated on a rate pegging increase of 3.6%. The rate peg percentage for 2012/2013 was set by IPART based on a Local Government Index and a productivity factor. The rate peg amount was announced by IPART on 6th December 2011.



Land Revaluation

The Valuer Generals Department completed its 3 yearly property revaluation for the Shoalhaven Council area in 2011. These valuations will be used for the levying of rates from 2012-2013 through to 2014-2015. Should you have any queries regarding the manner in which your property has been valued or you wish to lodge an objection to the valuation please contact the **Valuer Generals Office on 1800 110 038**.

Rates Assistance for Pensioners

Council assists eligible pensioners by providing a pensioner rate rebate and by allowing pensioners an interest free period to the 31st May each year to finalise their current rate account, interest free.

Note: Should there be a change to ownership details or pensioner card eliqibility, please contact Council's Rates Department on (02)4429 3210.

Am I Eligible for a Pension Rebate?

If you have been issued with a Pensioner Concession Card or a 'TPI' Gold Repatriation Health Card or an 'EDA' Gold Repatriation Health Card, you may be eligible for a rebate on your rates and charges. You must however own the property at the time the rate notice is served and it must be your sole or principal place of residence. If you have been issued with one of the cards mentioned above after the rate notice has been served, you may still be eligible for a rebate but it will be proportional to the number of rate instalments left payable, please contact Council's Rates Department on (02) 4429 3210.

Payment Options

Council has a number of payment methods that are available for customers to pay their accounts. Payments can be received at Council's Nowra or Ulladulla Offices, which also have EFTPOS facilities available. Other payment options include – Australia Post, B-Pay or Direct Debit. Should you wish to utilise the Direct Debit scheme please download the information from Councils website or call the Rates Department on 4429 3210 for assistance. Alternatively you may wish to pay your account by credit card online at Council's website or by phoning 1300 662 025.

Please note that payments made using a credit card attract a 1% surcharge.

Ranger Services

Ranger Services administer and enforce Acts, Regulations under various legislation and Council Policies. They also provide education to ensure Council and community compliance.

Rangers and Compliance

Rangers patrol the Shoalhaven focusing on environmental protection of public spaces and compliance on private land. Information from residents can greatly assist officers to enforce the regulations and provide education to the community. If you see someone harming trees, dumping rubbish or hazardous waste (e.g. asbestos), damaging property on public land, or undertaking unauthorised works on private land please contact Ranger Services.

Parking

Parking officers enforce regulations in Council and private car parks under lease and also for on-street parking. Schools are regularly patrolled to detect and deter parking offences which assists with safety for children entering and leaving school grounds.

Animal Management

The animal management team patrols the Shoalhaven and enforces provisions of the Companion Animals Act and Council's Access Areas for Dogs Policy. The team aims to reduce the incidents of dog attacks by focusing on dogs that are not under effective control in public areas.

Officers also pick up and return stray companion animals where possible – so if you have found a dog or cat please contact us.



Council's Animal Management Plan aims to effect compliance with State Government legislation and improve facilities for companion animals.

Home Sustainability Workshops



Throughout the year, Council offers a series of free workshops designed to teach residents how to live "more sustainably". Workshops include composting, worm farming, natural cleaning and organic veggie gardening. Dates and venues are advertised in the local media and on the Council website.

Council also sells compost bins and worm farms made from recyclable plastic.



Shoalhaven Beachwatch Program

Council's Environmental Health Officers undertake water quality monitoring at beaches throughout the Shoalhaven which helps identify health risks to swimmers.

During summer, 'star ratings' are generated weekly for each beach. The results are updated regularly on Council's website.

General Warnings for Safe Swimming

- Avoid swimming during and at least one day after heavy rain at ocean beaches, and for at least three days at harbour heaches, due to the pos
 - at harbour beaches, due to the possibility of pollution from stormwater drains.
- Avoid swimming near storm water drains or sewage outfalls.
- Avoid swimming if you see signs of pollution such as discoloured water, oil or scum on the water, and litter or other debris floating in the water or on the tide line.



New Draft Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan and Development Control Plan

The new draft Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan or LEP took a huge stride forward in 2011 with the draft Plan being publicly exhibited for 13 weeks. The 3000+ submissions received during the exhibition period covered a large range of issues which were considered at a series of Special Development Committee meetings in March and April 2012. It is intended that the draft LEP be publicly re-exhibited for a further 4 weeks in 2012 so that the community can view and comment on the amendments made to the Plan based on the issues raised in the submissions.

Council is also preparing a single, consolidated Development Control Plan (DCP) for the City. It is also likely to be placed on public exhibition in 2012 for comment so that it can be finalised in parallel with the new LEP.

Urban Design

Council has adopted the strategic direction of the Nowra CBD Master Plan and is working on a number of initiatives to implement the strategy - the opening of Junction Court, precinct planning for the riverfront, development framework for CBD key development sites and planning for new car parks and transport infrastructure.

Council has commenced construction of the Ulladulla board walk and continuing design and construction for the Ulladulla Civic Centre redevelopment.

Council can provide local heritage assistance grants to owners of heritage listed properties.

Recreation & Community Facility Planning

The Recreation and Community Facility Planning Unit are focused on delivering projects for the whole community. Planning of social infrastructure includes sportsgrounds, playgrounds, urban spaces and places, transport infrastructure, environmental spaces and places, cultural facilities and community hubs.

Shoalhaven residents will have an opportunity to express their ideas on current issues related to their local and district community and recreational facilities, during the future master planning phases.

Current infrastructure projects include Ulladulla Sports Park, additional fields at Ison Park and St Georges Basin, and guiding the redevelopment of the Ulladulla Civic Centre and Library. Policy reviews include a draft Plan of Management for Kangaroo Valley Showground.

Natural Resources & Floodplain Management

Coastal Zone Management Plan – The aim of the Plan is to manage and protect in a sustainable manner, the natural and man-made resources in the coastal zone. Community involvement will again be encouraged through workshops and public exhibition during 2012. Details of the Plan and its status can be found on Council's website.

Flood Management – Council is progressing with the implementation of its flood management program. Flood Risk Management Studies and Plans are currently being completed for Burrill Lake, Conjola Lake and Broughton Creek. Further community consultation will occur during 2012. Flood Risk Plans will be developed for other areas including Kangaroo Valley, Nowra Browns Creek and Lake Tabourie.

Estuary Management – Following extensive community surveys, the review of the Estuary Management Plans for St Georges Basin, Tabourie Lake, Lake Wollumboola and Conjola Lake will be exhibited for public comment during 2012.

Help Stamp Out Noxious Weeds

Noxious Weeds are a serious environmental and economic problem and need to be controlled. Council is responsible for the control of noxious weeds on its roadsides and reserves and for the inspection of privately owned land within the City.

Coloured brochures are available from Council showing which weeds have been declared noxious and what your responsibilities are as a

landowner. Council can arrange for weeds to be sprayed on your property on a fee for service basis.

Before clearing land or removing trees it is important to consult with Council and other government departments on whether prior approval is required. Shoalhaven City Council has a Tree Preservation

Order that protects trees while also providing exemptions in some circumstances for removal of trees that are in close proximity to approved buildings. You can check if you need approval by obtaining a Tree Information Pack by phoning (02) 4429 3610.

Vegetation is also protected through zoning provisions in Council's Local Environmental Plan. This means that a development application may be required to be submitted to Council if a property owner wants to clear vegetation. You can check if you require approval by contacting Council on telephone (02) 44293111. Approval to clear vegetation is also controlled by the Southern Rivers Catchment Management Authority. Exemptions are provided under the Native Vegetation Act 2003 to undertake some routine activities. To check if you require approval, you can phone the SRCMA on (02) 42249700. Trees and native vegetation provide habitat for threatened species or may be part of an endangered ecological community listed on the Threatened Species Conservation Act 1995. Assessment of vegetation to determine if it is threatened species habitat or part of an endangered ecological community needs to be undertaken prior to any clearing of vegetation. This would normally be done as part of the development application process or through a licence from the Department of Environment and Conservation. Failure to get appropriate approvals prior to removing trees or clearing vegetation can attract large fines, with penalties up to \$220 000 or two years in prison for destruction of threatened species habitat, and up to \$1.1 million for unauthorised clearing of native vegetation.

Development Advisory Unit

Council operates a Development Advisory Unit (DAU) to provide multi-disciplinary expert advice on complex development proposals prior to the submission of a development application. In this way issues that may arise during the assessment of your application can be identified (and in some cases resolved) before the application is prepared, thus avoiding costly delays.

Indian Myna Birds



Due to ongoing concerns from the community about the increase of the Indian Myna Bird population, the Shoalhaven supports Community Consultative **Bodies** myna bird program. Anecdotal evidence suggests this bird reduces biodiversity by competing with our native species for nesting hollows, destroying their eggs and killing their chicks. Colonies establish in

urban areas where food is plentiful and from there they invade the surrounding countryside to the detriment of our native wildlife.

We have several volunteer coordinators to assist you with understanding and trapping the Indian Myna Bird. Traps, which are being made at local mens sheds, are available for you to purchase. Council's Foreshore Reserves Policy

The Shoalhaven is home to an impressive 160km of coastline and estuary foreshore – an active part



of our natural environment, responsible for providing the vital link between aquatic and land based ecosystems. Within the Shoalhaven, Council manages a large proportion of this foreshore as a public reserve.

Recognising the environmental and recreational importance of our foreshore reserves, Shoalhaven City Council has reviewed its Foreshore Reserves Policy. The policy provides a management framework to guide decision making and determine how foreshore reserves should be used and managed. The policy is available on Council's website.

On-line Services - DA Tracking

The DA Tracking on-line system is proving popular with applicants and building owners. Accessed through Council's website www.shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au, the progress of a development application (DA) and a number of associated documents can be viewed on-line.

Managing Wastewater

Development and Environmental Services undertakes regular inspections of on-site effluent disposal systems within the City as part of the requirements to have an approval to operate each system.

There are over 7000 systems in the LGA. Council's focus is on assessment of the systems for the purposes of protecting public health, surface waters, ground waters, community amenities and promoting appropriate re-use of resources.

The performance of the system, it's ability to minimise environmental impacts and the location of the system in proximity to sensitive environmental receivers determines how frequently the approval to operate must be renewed; either 1, 3 or 5 years.

The long term performance of a system may be improved through regular maintenance. System owners should contact their local plumber or service contractor for specific advice on the operation and maintenance of their system. Alternatively, please contact council on **(02)** 4429 3111 for any general information or advice.

State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) 2008

Some minor development, called Exempt Development, does not require development consent; eg, carports, rainwater tanks, etc. Another type of small-scale development, called Complying Development, requires a Complying Development Certificate prior to commencing the use; eg, a new home, renovation or improvement. This certificate may be given by either Council or a Private Certifier.

Detailed information on Exempt and Complying Development is available on the NSW Department of Planning & Infrastructure website.

To determine if your property is suitable for such minor or small-scale development, Council suggests that you apply for a Section 149 (2) certificate which will provide this information.

Shoalhaven Contributions Plan

Council has overhauled its Contributions Plan and it is now fully available on Council's website. It provides full information about the Plan and the projects contributions are used for. There is also a facility to enable prospective developers to estimate contributions. The Plan won the Planning Institute of Australia (NSW Division) President's Award for Planning Excellence.

Bushcare

In the Shoalhaven we are lucky to share our home with a diverse and wide range of native plants and animals, some of which are rare and unique. We all love to work, live and play on our coast, rivers, lakes and escarpment. The bushland in the Shoalhaven is a part of our everyday life and it's one of the draw cards that attract so many visitors to our City. The Shoalhaven Bushcare Program is a way of bringing together the resources of Council and the Community to better manage our unique natural areas. Bushcare is also a great



way of meeting new friends and learning about what lives and grows in your local area. So grab your friends and get involved, there are over 70 Bushcare Groups working across the Shoalhaven. All groups work to an approved plan and are supported by Council.

Environmental Weeds



Environmental weeds are a major threat to the health of the natural bushland reserves throughout the Shoalhaven. Council implements control programs for priority environmental weeds at strategic

locations. Current projects focus on madiera vine, sea spurge, bitou bush and lantana. If you know of any outbreaks of these weeds, please call Parks Operations staff on 4429 3397.

Many environmental weeds are escaped garden plants. The species that threaten to invade our bushland are described in the booklet *Grow Me Instead – A Guide for Gardeners on the NSW South Coast.* This publication also recommends attractive, non-invasive garden replacement plants. Rabbit Control

Council will conduct rabbit baiting programs between April and October, at sites on and adjoining public reserves, where rabbits have become a problem and where sufficient local volunteers are available to help with the free feeding and monitoring. Training will be provided to volunteers who would need to have 8 hours available during the fortnight of the baiting program. Baiting is undertaken on a Monday and Thursday evening during these programs

Development & Building Services

The Development and Environmental Services Group provides a range of services to the development/building industry and to owner-builders in the Shoalhaven. A full range of building certification functions are provided at competitive rates, including Construction Certificates and Complying Development Certificates. You can also appoint Council as the Principal Certifying Authority for your project. Council's experienced Building Surveyors will carry out all mandatory critical stage inspections and will ensure that the building works are in compliance with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia and relevant Australian Standards. Council has a wide range of Codes, Policies and Guidelines available at the Administrative Offices in Nowra and Ulladulla and also online via Council's Internet Site to help in the preparation of development applications.

Flood Planning & Enquiries

If you live close to a lake, creek, river, major stormwater drain, or in a low-lying area, you may be at risk from flooding even if you haven't experienced it personally. Find out if you're flood affected. Flood information and flood maps showing flood affected areas are available on Council's website (www.shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au/Environment/Floodrisk.aspx) and also available from your local library and Council offices. Flood certificates, providing detailed information such as flood levels, can be purchased from Council to ensure you are fully aware of the risk from flooding to you and your property. You can also contact Council's Floodplain Engineers on 4429 3392.

What to do BEFORE a flood - know if your property is flood affected and if a flood guide has been prepared for your area. This can be done by contacting Council and your local SES (www.ses.nsw. gov.au). Early preparation before a flood can save lives and help decrease the amount of damage done to your property. Floods can happen quickly - prepare a family emergency kit. The SES can provide further advice on what to pack. Some items would include: torch, batteries, candles, waterproof matches and a laminated map of safe evacuation routes.

What to do DURING a flood.

- listen to local ABC radio for updates (FM97.3).
- you can also consult flood warnings, rainfall and river levels on the Bureau of Meteorology's website (www.bom.gov.au).
- listen to, and act on, advice from the SES and Police. Be prepared to evacuate.
- prepare yourself and your property by:
 - stacking furniture and other possessions beyond the reach of the water (place electrical goods on top);
 - securing objects that might float away and cause damage; and
 - moving stock and equipment to high ground.
- if you need assistance from the SES, call 132 500.
- for life-threatening emergencies, call 000.
- don't walk or drive through even shallow flood water.

Shoalhaven City Council has the responsibility to provide essential water and sewerage services to the city. These services are managed by Shoalhaven Water, a defined Business Group of Council, with a focus firmly on our community's desire to have a healthy lifestyle, and a high living standard whilst minimising the impact on our environment.

The performance of Shoalhaven Water is measured annually against all other Water Utilities in NSW and against comparably sized Water Utilities throughout Australia. In recent years Shoalhaven Water has performed at the "higher" end of the scale across a broad range of criteria which make up the National Water Commission National Performance Report and this has continued with the April 2012 data release.



Water main relocation – Hampton Bridge Kangaroo Valley


Shoalhaven Water has a Strategic Business Plan which covers the development and operation of the water and sewerage schemes. This document drives the business and provides supporting information for Council's Delivery Program and Operational Plan.

Providing Essential Services

Significant capital works have continued over the last 12 months and include;

- Kangaroo Valley Sewerage scheme construction \$16.8m
- · Shoalhaven Heads Sewerage Treatment Plant upgrade \$8m
- St Georges Basin Sewerage Treatment Plant upgrade \$5.5m
- Milton/Ulladulla Sewer Pumping Station upgrades \$4.5m
- Relining of Sewer Mains in the Nowra area \$2m
- Replace/Relocate Water Mains City wide \$2.2m

Laying the foundation for reliable, responsible and sustainable supply of services now and into the future, the planned Capital Works program in the coming years will cater for the Shoalhaven's growing population and meet environmental standards. Community expectations are also a key factor in the redevelopment of schemes and the future capital works. The future major works will include;

Billing & Payments

In 2012/13 the water usage charge will increase by \$0.05 cents per kilolitre and the annual water availability charge will increase by \$3.00. This will result in an annual charge of \$291.80 for a typical residential water bill (based on the average residential water supplied). As a comparison, the typical residential bill *Nationally in 2010/11 was \$428.13 and *NSW \$424.86.

The annual sewerage availability charge will increase by \$33.00 and this charge whilst higher than the NSW and National average is reflective of the high cost in providing multiple sewerage schemes and transfer of waste across the city. Eligible pensioner customers continue to receive the maximum available rebate against water and sewerage charges.

A Payment Assistance Scheme is available for residential customers who find themselves financially disadvantaged and having difficulty paying their water usage charges because of a crisis. The Payment Assistance Scheme provides vouchers which can be offset against the Water Account.

Shoalhaven Water has introduced a "smart card" to help make regular payments easy. This wallet sized card contains your Water Account details and can be used at any Australia Post outlet or at Council Offices to make regular payments.

Statement of Business Ethics

Purpose

This statement provides guidance for all sectors of the Community when conducting business with Shoalhaven City Council.

Statement

This statement applies to all dealings between council and sectors of the community when conducting business with Shoalhaven City Council. It outlines Councils aims to:

- Build and maintain ethical relationships with all sectors of the community and in particular the private sector.
- Encourage transparency and accountability in all dealings including lending, contracting, supply of goods and services and business partnerships.
- Ensure other sector partners understand Council's public duty obligations.
- Manage the potential risk and misunderstanding that can occur in business transactions between the public and private sectors.
- Maintain corruption-resistant, ethical work practices.



2012 Local Government Election

On 8 September 2012, Council will be conduction an election for the Mayor and 12 Councillors who will serve the Shoalhaven over the next four years. Voting is compulsory for all residents registered on the electoral roll.

New residents may also apply for inclusion on the roll by completing an application form available from your local post office, by contacting the Australian Electoral Commission on 132326 or downloading a form from the following link: https://forms.australia.gov.au/forms/aec/electoral%20enrolment/. Forms are also available from Council.

Those who are not enrolled as a resident are entitled to make application for inclusion on the Non - Residential Roll or the Roll for Ratepaying lessees. There are some important aspects to be aware of in respect to eligibility for the Non – Residential Roll, which include

- Joint owners of properties are required to nominate one person who can vote.
- Regardless of the number of properties owned, the person can only be nominated in respect to one of those parcels. If no nomination is made, the General Manager can nominate one of them as an elector.

Advertising will appear in local newspapers shortly inviting nonresident ratepayers or ratepaying lessees to nominate for inclusion on the rolls. Any person wishing to be included may contact Council on 44293111 or download an application form available by the following link (to be included when known) Details of Candidates and Polling Booth locations will be notified by Public Notice.

It is important for Resident Electors to remember that they must vote in their Ward. If you are resident in the City, the rate notice for your residence will show the Ward in which you are enrolled. Voters wishing to check their Ward may access the State Electoral Office website via the following link: http://www.elections.nsw.gov.au/enrol_to_vote/am_i_enrolled
