

Glossy Black-cockatoo



The Glossy Black-cockatoo loves to crunch on the cones of Casuarina trees (She-oaks). You might hear them squawking as they fly to their favourite feed trees around the Shoalhaven. Males are completely black in colour, except their prominent red tail bands. The females are dark brownish with some yellow spotting.

The Glossy Black-cockatoo needs large tree hollows for nesting and the cones of the She-oak for survival. They are threatened because land clearing has removed large areas of their habitat. If you have She-oaks on your property - don't clear them, they may become a feed tree for the Glossy Black Cockatoo.
