

The Green & Golden Bell Frog



This colourful frog loves to sunbake. It breeds in shallow puddles and pools of water with reeds that it can bask on during the day. It used to be common across south east Australia but is now restricted to small isolated populations in swamps and wetlands along the NSW coast. Threats to the species are mosquito fish that eat the tadpoles, a fungal disease that kills the frog while it hibernates and habitat destruction by humans. Our Green and Golden Bell Frogs here in the Shoalhaven are doing really well at the moment.
