

The Squirrel Glider gets its name from its thick bushy tail that looks like a squirrel's. They are a nocturnal species and can glide up to 50m from tree to tree. They live in family groups in forested areas where there are hollows for shelter and plentiful blossoms and insects for food. If you live near a forested area you might hear them chattering to each other at night with deep and throaty gurgles and soft grunts that sound somewhat like "n-when".

Threats to the Squirrel Glider are land clearing, logging and fire. Without hollows in trees for shelter and protection they are vulnerable to predators, in particular cats, foxes and owls.
