



FOWLS – should not be kept within 4.5 metres of a dwelling, public hall, school or premises used for the manufacture, preparation, sale or storage of food. Council may decide that a greater distance is required in a particular case.

POULTRY – other than fowls (such as ducks, geese etc.) should not be kept within 30 metres of any building mentioned above.

ROOSTERS – being kept in residential areas is **not recommended** as they create noise problems and are not required for egg production.



POULTRY HOUSES – should be paved with concrete or mineral asphalt underneath the roosts or perches.

This **does not** apply to poultry houses that are:

- (a) *further than 15.2 metres from any building mentioned above; or*
- (b) *situated on clean sand.*

POULTRY YARDS – should be enclosed so as to prevent the escape of poultry.

NOTE – These guidelines are binding only after Council has served a notice stating that they apply to the land.



Regardless of these guidelines, chickens and poultry must not be a nuisance or a health risk and poultry yards must be kept clean and free of offensive odours.

Development consent may be required for the construction of poultry and fowl houses. Contact your area planner for further information.
