Libraries host summer reading club

Summer holidays are a great time to delve into some stories and Shoalhaven Libraries is hosting a fun reading activity that will run for the duration of the summer break.

This years theme is Scare up a Good Book and everyone is invited to celebrate with a party to launch the program at 4pm on December the 1st 2010.

The Summer Reading Club is for young people aged 13 and under and everyone who joins up gets a certificate and goodie pack.

The idea of the club is to read as much as possible over the holiday period. The more you read the more chances there are to win some great prizes.

It's free to join the club and registration can be done at all branches of Shoalhaven Libraries. You need to be a member of the library to get involved so if you haven't already got a library card now is the time to join.

In conjunction with the program there is a book club running on Wed 8th & 15th Dec at 4pm and Wed 12th & 19th Jan at 10am. The club is for children aged 5-12 and usually runs for 45 mins so come along to enjoy craft activities and books.

The program will close on Friday 21st January 2011 with a presentation at 10am. This will be a dress up party with a spooky/ghoulish theme.

The program is always a huge success and sees an encouraging amount of reading throughout the Shoalhaven. 92 people participated last year and collectively read over 1500 books. So make sure you are part of this fun club over Summer.
