The weather is warming up and its time to enjoy a swim in one of Shoalhaven City Councils pools in and around the Shoalhaven.

Nowra and village pools at Berry, Greenwell Point, Milton and Shoalhaven Heads opened on the 20th of November 2010 ready for the busy summer holiday period.

Shoalhaven City Mayor Clr. Paul Green encourages the area's locals and visitors to visit one of the pools and leisure centres and make the most of the services available.

"This time of year is great for building up fitness levels and when it's hot, swimming is a comfortable way to exercise. All village pools (apart from Berry 19 metres) are 25 metres, making them perfect for lap swimming. From the natural open air environment of the sea pools at Ulladulla and Huskisson to the multi-functional leisure centres, there is something for everyone this summer." CIr. Green said.

Nowra and the village pools are supervised, with trained staff on hand, they also offer kiosks for light snacks and beverages and separate toddler pools with shade sails for younger children and their families Enjoy a day at the pool relaxing with friends and family!

The sea pools at Huskisson and Ulladulla are also open and offering a refreshing dip in beautiful coastal settings. The sea pools operate on an unsupervised basis and no life guarding service is available.

Swimming in your local pool is a convenient way to cool down on those long hot days, so be sure to visit one of the eight pools in the Shoalhaven this summer.
