## Improvements to the city streetscapes on their way

The northern entrance to Bomaderry along the Princes Highway will be looking a lot more attractive in the coming weeks as Council's Park staff begin to enhance the landscaping in the area.

Commencing on the 29<sup>th</sup> November, the work will be undertaken over two weeks taking into account the unpredictable weather of late. If the weather remains fine the works will be complete in a shorter period.

All work will be undertaken outside of peak travelling times to limit disturbance to the public.

The landscaping redesign will include mulching and planting of Cambewarra Road roundabout and splitter islands.

A section of the highway median from Cambewarra Road to Birriley Street will also undergo mulching and replacement planting.

Other improvements to the City over the summer months include the installation of new banners along the highway in Nowra and new entrance signs at Ulladulla on both the southern and northern approaches to town.

Shoalhaven City Mayor Councillor Paul Green said "It's great to see some freshening up of our town's entrances and roadways, especially at this time of year when we have lots of visitors stopping by. These kinds of works all add to the natural beauty of the Shoalhaven."
