Dump your old television – free

If you have an old television set or two, you can drop them off on Shoalhaven City Council's free domestic television recycling days during Local Government Week 2010.

Council will hold two days where all citizens can drop off up to two old television sets. Council is aiming to remove as many as the old analogue and non-working televisions during this period.

Shoalhaven City Mayor Councillor Paul Green said Local Government Week is an ideal opportunity to drop off that old television.

"The theme for the week is Building a Brighter Future and we now have the old analogue television signals being turned off across NSW, so this is an ideal time to rid your household of the old TV," Cr Green said.

"Council is working with a local contractor to recycle the materials and plastics in old televisions so this is an ideal opportunity to reduce the e-waste in your household."

The Television Drop Off days are:

- Saturday 7 August 2010 – Council's Administration Centre, Deering St, Ulladulla
- Sunday 8 August 2010 – Council's Administration Centre car park Graham Street, Nowra

Both days will be open from 9.30am to 3pm.

There is no charge for recycling the televisions and remote controls; no other electrical items will be accepted. No more than two televisions per residence. Any televisions with broken glass will not be accepted for safety reasons
