Kinghorne Street update

Work on revitalising Kinghorne Street Nowra is moving past Junction Street and past the halfway mark.

Acting Shoalhaven City Mayor Councillor Gareth Ward said businesses and customers in the Nowra CBD have been patient for good purpose. "These works will give the city an uncluttered streetscape with brighter pavers, more trees and seats. This uncluttered and fresh streetscape will help people coming into town enjoy a meal or coffee, while they do their business," Cllr Ward said. "The works are going according to plan with the contractors working hard day and night."

Works to be completed on the southern side of Junction Street include the sealing of the pavers, seating, and trees.

The revitalisation works will now move outside the CUA Credit Union in Kinghorne Street and move towards the Aldi Supermarket. While the works are underway access to all businesses will remain during all stages of construction and where possible customers should use the rear access or access via Stewart Place.
