Mayor welcomes \$2,012,000 funding

Shoalhaven City Mayor Councillor Paul Green has welcomed the \$2,012,000 funding from the NSW government for upgrading eight tourist parks in the city.

The announcement today by NSW Minister for Lands Tony Kelly is very welcome.

“The city is fortunate to have wonderful tourist parks throughout the city, from Shoalhaven Heads in the North to Lake Tabourie in the south. All these parks offer a wonderful, peaceful, calm and enjoyable place to stay for thousands of visitors each year. These funds will go towards upgrades for cabins, playgrounds, security, kitchens and shade sails which will make people’s stays far more enjoyable while in the Shoalhaven.”

The funding will go towards projects in the following tourist parks:

- \$616,250 for security, cabins, playground, ensuite units, and renovation of the amenities block at Lake Conjola Entrance Tourist park
- \$560,000 for construction of new family cabins, camp kitchen, and landscaping works at Huskisson White Sands Tourist Park
- \$343,250 for security, playground, and sewer system at Currarong Beachside Tourist Park
- \$143,250 for security and playground at Ulladulla Headland Tourist Park
- \$116,250 for ensuite units, security, and playground at Lake Tabourie Tourist Park
- \$73,250 for security, playground, and shade sails at Bendalong Point Tourist Park
- \$73,250 for security, playground, and shade sails at Crookhaven Heads Tourist Park
- \$43,250 for security, and playground at Shoalhaven Heads Tourist Park.

The funding is provided under the NSW Government’s Public Reserves Management Fund.\
