INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the second quarter report for Shoalhaven City Council. This report provides a snapshot of how the organisation has performed against targets during the second quarter of this financial year (2015/2016). It includes highlights that showcase some of the important work Council is doing and the status of current activities from the Delivery Program. Council will continue to monitor its performance to ensure it remains on track to achieve its key priorities.

People



- Council officially opened two new waterslides at Nowra Aquatic Park. Council held a competition to name the slides and after much deliberation the winning names were determined as 'The Vortex' (closed slide named by Maya Berardi) and 'Rampage' (open slide named by Jake O' Neil).
- Council completed works on a new concrete fishing platform and path at the Crookhaven Heads Boat Ramp. The \$27,000 platform and pathway were constructed on an existing rock platform and allow easy disabled access to the platform from the adjacent car park.
- Council hosted a special Community Safety Meeting at the North Nowra Community Centre to allow the community to provide input into the ways Nowra can become an even safer place in which to reside.
- Lake Conjola Holiday Park employee, Peter Upton received the Employee of the Year Award at the Caravan and Camping Industry Association's Awards of Excellence. Mr Upton was recognised for his unwavering dedication and commitment to ensuring Lake Conjola Holiday Park remains one of the prominent tourist destinations on the South Coast.

- Council refreshed the streetscape within the Bomaderry commercial precinct on Meroo and Bunberra Streets. Works included the painting of lamp posts, garbage bin surrounds, seats and other street furniture. The works were in addition to the fantastic refurbishments undertaken by the Bomaderry Pride in order to revitalise the streetscape ahead of the Waratah March.
- Council celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Huskisson Sea Pool with a special morning tea to celebrate the milestone and signify the official opening of the swimming season.
- Council released the new'Pets on Holiday' brochure outlining the area's dog, horse and cat friendly accommodation, walks and other activities.
- Stage II of Jelly Bean Park was officially opened during a special beach-themed barbecue in the CBD. Stage II of the project features the addition of an innovative misting device designed to cool down local residents in the already popular meeting hub.
- Major Rehabilitation works commenced in Wallace Street, Nowra. The works involve the removal of the existing pavement and construction of a new bound pavement with an asphalt surface. Council also undertook heavy patching works on Gerroa and Bolong Roads, Shoalhaven Heads.

- Council commenced works on Turpentine Road, Tomerong which involved the rehabilitation and realignment of the road from the turnoff to the Princes Highway extending works towards Main Road 92. These significant works were funded by over \$5.2 million of Council funding and the Gilmore Safety Package, Black Spot and Roads to Recovery Programs.
- Council commenced the upgrade of the Browns Creek crossing on Quinn's Lane, South Nowra. The project included the installation of a larger capacity drainage culvert crossing to provide enhanced flood free access to the area.
- The annual Riverfestival was held, with Council as a key sponsor. The two day community event celebrating life
 in our beautiful City attracted significant numbers of people to the Shoalhaven. The event included a range of
 family friendly activities, kicking off with the Nowra CBD street parade showcasing community groups and local
 businesses. Fireworks, music and the Shoalhaven Colour Me Fun Run were all held by the Shoalhaven River as
 part of the festival.
- Council officially opened the Nowra Aquatic Park providing the local community with a modern state of the art facility suitable for both competitive and social swimming. The \$8 million project delivered a new nine lane pool, a recreational splash pad as well as new filtration equipment and pool heating.
- Council again scored extremely well in the annual State of the Beaches Report with the area's beaches rated among the cleanest in NSW. The report graded six of the area's 10 ocean beaches as Very Good and the remaining four as Good.
- Council hosted a delegation from Fuyang City, China for a special ceremony where Mayor, Joanna Gash signed a Friendship City Agreement on behalf of Council with Fuyang City.

- Nowra Library was recognised for their unique and innovative new literacy program 'Paws 'n'Tales'. The Library received
 a Highly Commended Award in the Program Category at the NSW Public Libraries Marketing Awards. 'Paws 'n' Tales'
 aims to improve participants reading and communication skills by having children between the ages of four to eight
 regularly read to an animal.
- Mayor, Joanna Gash welcomed the 2015 Shoalhaven Community Survey results which demonstrated an increase in the organisation's overall satisfaction rating. The organisation received an 85 percent overall satisfaction rating which was a two percent increase on the previous year's result.
- Council hosted a community workshop for local residents to have their say on the potential future of the Huskisson Foreshore Precinct. The two day workshop was hosted in conjunction with project consultants SJB Architects and was attended by over 50 local residents. The workshop has helped inform the work currently being undertaken on the proposed Masterplan and Development Concepts for the area.
- Shoalhaven Libraries launched an innovative new digital membership service allowing the community to access the Library's full range of digital services without leaving their home.

- Council awarded the tender for the \$6.5 million Porters Creek Dam Remediation project to Leed Engineering and Construction. The project, which is expected to be completed by the end of this year, will see the preparation and placement of approximately 4,000 cubic metres of concrete along the downstream face of the dam.
- Council welcomed the State Government announcement that saw the organisation assessed as being 'Fit for the Future'. The State Government set seven benchmarks for Councils to meet to ensure they were classified by IPART as being 'Fit for the Future' and able to continue to deliver the services expected from communities across NSW.
- Council launched new CCTV cameras in East Nowra and Sanctuary Point, adding to the cameras already installed in the Bomaderry area.
- Council extended the popular off leash trial at Narrawallee Beach enabling local residents to continue to utilise the off leash area through the summer months. The trial will stay in place until the completion of a city wide community consultation exercise and dog management Policy review has been undertaken. The review is expected by August 2016.
