Funding Success for Roads

Shoalhaven City Council has been successful in gaining funding from Federal and State government bodies to assist in developing road projects in the 2017-2018 and 2018-19 financial years.

- Four new Australian Government
 Blackspot Program projects have been approved totalling \$1,175,000.
- Three Aboriginal Communities projects have been approved funded by NSW Government Aboriginal Communities Program to be delivered in 2017/18 totalling \$445,000.
- NSW Government Country Passenger Transport Infrastructure Grants
 Scheme (CPTIGS) 2017/18 program has granted \$180,000 to support eighteen new shelters and associated works aimed at improving disabled access at bus stop locations.

Not for Profits are the Winners

Not-for-profit organisations have benefited from the 2017 Shoalhaven ClubGRANTS. ClubGRANTS is a shared State Government-Club Industry program, funded by a 1.85% gaming machine tax rebate provided by the State Government to those registered clubs with gaming machine profits more than \$1 million per annum. Registered clubs with annual gaming machine revenue exceeding \$1 million are to apply 0.75% of those funds to Category 1 purposes.

A local committee administered by Council made recommendations for Category 1 funding from local applications totalling \$305,525 across the Shoalhaven. Read more here.

Council has received a \$50,000 grant towards funding the construction of the bike path from the NSW Department of Family and Community Services.

The Learn To Ride bike path is aimed at toddlers, pre-school and school aged children to improve their early bicycle
