Learn more about the Proposed Special Rate Variation

Shoalhaven City Council is inviting the community to learn and provide comment on the proposed Special Rate Variation. Council is proposing to apply to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal for a continuation of the 13.2% rate increase that was applied to ratepayers this year. The previous increase was only approved to be implemented for a one-year period and Council is seeking for this increase to remain in place for the future.

As part of this application Council will also be seeking a 5% rate increase (including the rate peg) for each of the next three years. This increase is to meet the ongoing maintenance and renewal needs of our community infrastructure. The proposed increased revenue will fund maintenance and improvements to Shoalhaven roads, parks, sport fields and other community assets. [Learn more here.](#)

In the simplest terms, the general purpose rate increase means you would pay 5% more than the current year. If your general rates were \$1000 in 2017/18 they will be \$1050 in 2018/19.

Roads and Works Update

Cambewarra - Tannery Road - Maintenance grading and re-sheeting are being undertaken until 26 October. Further works will be undertaken prior to June 2018, to prepare and seal the existing unsealed road.

Brundee - Greenwell Point Road - Road pavement reconstruction, reshaping and shoulder widening are being undertaken at the intersection of Greenwell Point and Mayfield Roads to provide a new stabilised pavement and high friction asphalt surface at the intersection. From 4 November to the 1 December, Greenwell Point Road will be closed to through traffic between Millbank Road and Jindy Andy Lane and vehicles detoured at these locations.

RECENTLY COMPLETED WORKS



Cambewarra - Barfield Road - Construction of sealed pavement over existing gravel pavement between Mossvale Road and Tannery Road has been completed.

Myrning Grove - The construction of the approximately 105m of kerb and guttering between #14 & #22 Myrning Grove has been finalised.

Nowra - Stewart Place Bus Interchange Area -

Callala Bay - Callala Beach Road (Pictured) – Road pavement reconstruction and road widening have been completed. A final seal will be undertaken prior to November 2018.

Callala Beach Road and Forest Road Intersection
– Road widening and safety improvements. A final seal or asphalt wearing course will be placed prior to November 2018.

The wind break has been installed and the line marking works have been completed.

Wharf Road - The Wharf Road boat ramp, wharf and car park are operational now, after demolition of the Nowra Sailing Club.

The aim of Graffiti Removal Day is to highlight the problem of graffiti across NSW and encourage people to volunteer to remove and prevent graffiti. Graffiti vandalism costs the NSW Government and residents more than \$300 million every year and it has to stop.

What can you do - Prevent it

There are some simple things that you can do to deter graffiti, including;

- Plan for easy graffiti removal (i.e. rough surfaces)
- Install lighting
- Consider a mural
- [Project Eyewatch](#) - is based on the social networking site Facebook, enabling locals to exchange information with police about crime and report issues of concern, in real time.

Remove it

Council strongly recommends that you remove all graffiti as soon as you can. Not only will the graffiti be easier to remove, but your quick response sends a positive message to the community.
