

Porters Creek Dam upgrade monumental

"History starts with us".

Director of Shoalhaven Water, Carmel Krogh, last week opened the upgraded Porters Creek Dam. In an extract from her speech, she recalled that the opening of this dam was a "once in a career project". In this issue, we share part of her opening speech that showed the excitement, pride and joy of this project.

"To put the whole project in context, I need to give you my simplified version of dam building 101. The original dam was built in 1967. The dam was a post tensioned concrete dam which relied on 74 cables through the concrete to the rock bed for stability. These post-tensioning cables were provided in the original design to reduce the cross section of the dam so it made it a thinner walled dam with less concrete. In addition to the structural cable, monitoring cables were also installed during the original construction to monitor the structural cables.

Unfortunately over time, two of the monitoring

With some serendipity, the project has also had some other indirect positive outcomes including sealing over 3.5 km of the access road and making the highway intersection much safer, and I must acknowledge the great partnership we had with the RMS to bring that about.

Similarly the cooperation, support and tolerance of the local community has made the job much easier, and we have all greatly appreciated that.

Working on the dam ..50 years on

When the original dam was constructed in 1967 by Shoalhaven Shire Council, it was designed and supervised by GHD. There was a young 17 year old named Laurie Andrew who started his working life at that time as a trainee surveyor with GHD on that project.

Fifty years later, that same Laurie Andrew is a Coordinator with Shoalhaven Water and acted as Council's site supervisor for the upgrade.

We could not have picked a better person – I have thought long and hard about what to say about Laurie, and any superlatives I come up with are still inadequate.

His dedication, commitment, and the level of pride that he has taken in this role has been an absolute joy to watch. He has gone over and above in both major things and in the smallest details and made such a personal investment in this project and fills me with such pride it makes me want to cry."

cables failed load testing due to corrosion. This left Council with a situation where such a critical piece of infrastructure could not meet modern day requirements for stability and the potential failure of the dam posed an unacceptable risk for Council.

Porters Creek Dam is an integral part of the water supply system for the Southern area of the Shoalhaven LGA. Raw water is supplied from the dam to the Milton Water Treatment Plant before it is distributed to the southern areas. At peak times of demand the southern water supply can be supplemented from water drawn from Nowra, but the peak demand cannot be met entirely from the north. So when we embarked on this upgrade we only had a window of opportunity of less than 12 months to make sure that the construction was finished before the next peak Christmas period in 2016. We met that target - despite a number of challenges including the famous East Coast Low event last June that rapidly filled the dam, overtopped the spillway and flooded the construction site.

Many people think that any work on a dam should give you more water, but this project has been all about security of the current supply, and the renewal of a major existing asset - probably not very sexy from a public or political perspective, and that is why I give great credit to the Council to have shown the leadership to fully fund this project.

As part of Council's ongoing commitment to preserving and enhancing its road pavement assets, a bitumen road resealing program will be undertaken in the following locations throughout the Shoalhaven commencing Monday, 20 March 2017. Weather permitting, this work will be completed by Monday, 10 April 2017.
