The Chosen City

Last Sunday, Mayor Amanda Findley welcomed the community to her End of Summer Pool Party where she announced that the eyes of the Commonwealth will be on the Shoalhaven.

On Monday, 5 February 2018, as the Queen's Baton journeys will journey through Nowra on its way towards its final destination on the Gold Coast for the 2018 Commonwealth Games Opening Ceremony to be held on 4 April 2018.

Local legends are being called on to carry the Queen's Baton in the Shoalhaven as it prepares to host the Queen's Baton Relay.

Setting off in Australia on 25 December 2017, the Queen's Baton will travel for 100 days and will carry a message from Her Majesty which will be officially read at the opening ceremony.

Whilst in the Shoalhaven, it will be carried around the Nowra CBD and end up at the Shoalhaven Entertainment Centre where a fun community party will take place.

Road and Works Update

Quinns Lane and Old Southern Road, South

Nowra - Works are progressing on the roundabout construction at the Quinns Lane and Old Southern Road intersection.

Due to wet weather and service relocation works, the completion of the project has

Bolong/Coolangatta/Gerroa Intersection & Coolangatta Road Upgrade - Road works will commence late March/early April (weather permitting) on the upgrade of the final section of Coolangatta Road and on improvements to the Bolong Road and Coolangatta Road intersection. The works are expected to be completed by August.

Centre island works are planned over the coming weeks that will allow the intersection to start working as a roundabout.

Traffic control measures will continue to minimise disruption to the flow of traffic.



placed near Berry, on Gerroa Road north of Coolangatta Road, and on Bolong Road south of Coolangatta Road. Traffic control will be in place during construction.

Ulladulla South Street Roundabout Works have commenced on site for the construction of the roundabout at South Street and Jubilee Ave Ulladulla. Rain over the past few weeks has delayed the start of the project. The project is now expected to be completed late May.

During the works South Street, Jubilee Ave and the adjoining carpark access are closed.

Access to residents will be maintained throughout the project.
