Road Works



Women and Concrete

Over the last six year's the Bawley Point and Kioloa Community Association have slowly been building a shared path to link the two villages using a combination of their own community workforce and Council funds under the auspices of the Community Pathway Program.

A number of concrete teams have developed over the years and, to the credit of the community, they have now organised a woman's concreting team. Is this a first for the Shoalhaven?

Road Works

South Nowra - Albatross Road and Flinders Road Roundabouts (as at 24/05/18) -

Approval has been received for the final relocation of electrical infrastructure at the roundabouts. These works will commence early June with an outage date to switch to the new infrastructure hopefully late June (to be confirmed). Following the changeover the removal of the existing power poles can proceed and the northern side of the secondary roundabout constructed. The primary roundabout on Albatross Road will have the final AC layer placed in conjunction with secondary roundabout final surface. The links from Albatross Road onto the Albatross Service Road have limited access off Albatross Road. Each end will be closed at times to suit works on the secondary roundabout. At this stage completion of the roundabouts will be in late July. Changed traffic conditions are operating for the duration of works. Note that where road work speed limit signs or traffic controls are displayed or used, the speed limit and controls are enforceable and must be obeyed.

Flinders Road Upgrade (Norfolk Avenue to Nowra Creek Bridge) Additional sealing works are being carried out to include the existing road surface, including profiling works to improve rideability. Linemarking is scheduled for early June. Works are continuing on the shared user path on the south side from the bridge heading west. The path will be extending through to Albatross Service Road to now link with the new roundabout footpaths.

Bomaderry, Bolong Road – Infill of old garden bed on Bolong Road/Meroo Street roundabout to improve the turning area for large vehicles.

Currarong, Lighthouse Road – Maintenance grading is scheduled to commence in the week commencing 28 May 2018.

Hyams Beach, Naval College Road - Road pavement rehabilitation of the east-bound lane is planned in June.

North Nowra, Greys Beach – Installation of construction piles and pontoons at Greys Beach will be carried out in the coming months. Access to certain areas of the foreshore will be restricted during construction.

Sussex Inlet, Sussex Inlet Road – Shoulder grading at selected locations. Works are scheduled commencing 28 May 2018.

Please note that all quoted completion dates are subject to change due to weather conditions, emergencies or other unforeseen interruptions.

Council Banking Change

Council has changed its banking and bill payment services from the National Australia Bank to the Commonwealth Bank of Australia.

Please be aware that timings to Council's direct debit payments to bank accounts may



change as it is now coming from a different institution.

Solar Gardens

Council has launched a feasibility study to support the development of a 'Solar Garden' in the Shoalhaven.

The Social Access Solar Gardens project aims to help customers in apartments, rentals or low-income housing to reap the benefits of solar.

A 'solar garden' is a centralised solar power station that offers households the opportunity to purchase panels with the electricity generated credited on their electricity bill. This provides an innovative solution to accessing renewable energy for the 30 percent of Australian consumers who are unable to install solar on their homes.

The project is being led by the UTS Institute for Sustainable Futures and Community Power Agency, with participation from 17 partner organisations, including the Shoalhaven City Council. [Read more](#)
