



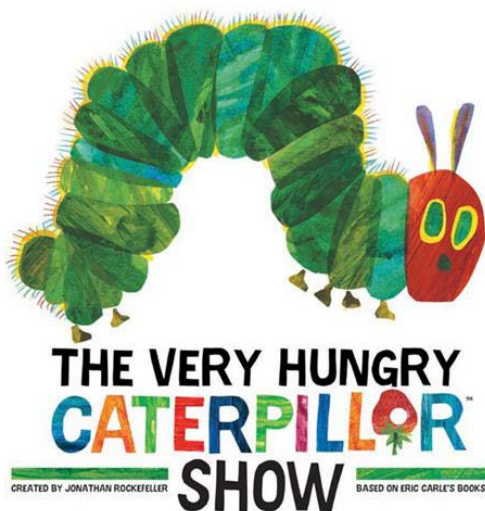
Bridge Funded

The RMS project cost is \$310 million with work likely to begin in the second half of 2020.

Council will be constructing a set of Pedestrian Traffic Signals to improve pedestrian safety at

Hyams Beach Naval College Road -

Maintenance patching over 1.2km of the north bound lane, between Erowal Bay Road and the Booderee entrance.

Sanctuary Point Centaur Avenue – The concrete footpath from Idlewild Street will be continued around the corner into Centaur Ave toward the school rear entrance.

Nowra Collins Way - Additional parking is being constructed on the grass area adjacent to the School of Arts annex building.

Fireweed

Council is reminding residents that it is the responsibility of all landowners and occupiers to ensure fireweed is managed effectively throughout the region.

Fireweed is an invasive, poisonous weed that is easily identified by its yellow flowers. Each flower has 13 petals. It has a significant impact on our rural residents as it competes with pasture and it is toxic to livestock.

With recent rain and the onset of cooler weather fireweed has started germinating throughout the Shoalhaven.
