Flying Fox Colony

Council has been granted \$47,130 under the Local Government NSW (LG NSW) Stream 1 Flying-fox grant program to manage the Bomaderry Grey-Headed <u>Flying Fox</u> population and the effect they have on residential properties and owners.

Low Rise Medium Density Housing Code Deferral

The Department of Planning and Environment has advised that Shoalhaven City Council has been successful in receiving a 12-month deferral from the implementation of the Low Rise Medium Density Housing Code (the Code) amendment to State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) 2008. The Code would enable the consideration of certain medium density development as complying development in Shoalhaven's R1 General Residential, R3 Medium Density Residential and RU5 Villages zones. The Code applies to one and two storey dual occupancies, manor houses and multidwelling housing (terraces).

Upcoming Roadworks



Flinders Road South Nowra - The final asphalt layer on the primary roundabout on Albatross Road will be completed next Tuesday and Wednesday.

Motorists are advised of traffic disruption with traffic control in place. The Link from Albatross Road onto the Albatross Service Road will be open to traffic while construction is being done. Business and residents located on the service road are advised to use the Albatross Road connections where practical to avoid Flinders Road.

The Secondary Roundabout on Albatross Road will also have some asphalt works completed next Tuesday and Wednesday. The timing for the removal of the existing power poles is yet to be determined to enable the works to proceed for the northern side of the secondary roundabout. At this stage completion of the roundabouts is possibly late August.

Note that where road work speed limit signs or traffic controls are displayed or used, the speed limit and controls are enforceable and must be obeyed.

The Council operated shelter aims to ensure the animals that are found receive the best support and can be adopted to caring people.

Set on five acres, the modern facility provides more space for animals and offers private rooms for adopting families to meet their new fur companion. Paws and Think

Dogs are more and more becoming part of the family with over 42,000 dogs registered in the Shoalhaven – nearly one dog for every three households. However, some dogs can be dangerous. Shoalhaven City Council has launched an educational campaign on responsible dog ownership with an aim to avoid dog attacks in the area.

The Paws and Think campaign encourages responsible dog ownership. Ensure your dog is desexed, trained and kept secure and keep the dog active with regular walks. Get your dog microchipped and registered and your details are up-to-date on the Companion Animals Register.

Paws and Think and be a responsible dog owner. Dogs can bite! Ensure your dog is on a lead when you are out and about and secure



in their back yard. Warn people if your dog may bite and where possible train your dog. Visit the Council<u>website</u> at for more handy hints.
