Nowra - Junction Street/Princes Highway

Traffic Signals - CIVX Pty Ltd on behalf of Shoalhaven City Council will be constructing a set of Pedestrian Traffic Signals to improve pedestrian safety at the intersection of the Princes Highway and Junction Street, Nowra. Works are scheduled to commence in late July 2018 and are expected to take approximately three months. Council understands that the construction work may affect traffic at times however will work closely with the contractor to minimise disruption during peak and holiday periods. Local traffic controls will be in place during construction with motorists asked to exercise caution and follow the traffic directions during this time.

Six Smoke Alarm Safety Tips

These life-saving devices have been compulsory in homes and accommodation 1. buildings since

2006.

REQUIREMENTS Ensure your smoke alarms meet the equirements of Australian Standards (AS3786). Hard-wired to the mains electricity power supply with battery backup. If your alarms cannot be hard-wired, NSW Fire recommends smoke alarms that rely on 10-year lithium batteries.

LOCATION IN THE HOME

2. LOCATION IN THE DOTTE Smoke alarms should be located on every level in Smoke alarms should be located on every level in the home, in the hallway or room outside bedroom/s and in any story that does not include bedrooms.

3. MORE BEDS MORE RULES Shared accommodation, depending on the use and Class of the building, have more stringent requirements for placement and installations as outlined in the Building Code of Australia and relevant Australian Standards.

10 YEAR LIFE SPAN

Smoke alarms have a life span of 10 year from manufacturing. It is a requirement to check and replace out of date smoke alarms with new compliant Smoke Alarms.

HARD OF HEARING

Is Your Smoke Alarm Working? Smoke Alarms Save Lives

The risk of a fatality in a home fire is halved if there is a working smoke alarm in a residential dwelling.

As we hit the mid Winter mark and experience cold night time temperatures, the Council Compliance team would like to remind people about the fire dangers of heaters, electric blankets, open fires, candles and other devices.

According to Fire and Rescue NSW, there is a 10 per cent increase in the number of home fires in colder months.

Compliance Officers are reminding you to be vigilant particularly about ensuring that your smoke alarm is working.

Don't forget to turn off heaters, blow out candles and turn off electric blankets before leaving home or getting into bed.

State Funding Received

Council has been successful in receiving a grant of \$165,666.67 from the NSW Government Floodplain Management Program.

Council would like to acknowledge Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock and the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage for the grant that will assist in completing two flood studies on Currarong Creek and Millards Creek. Currarong Creek originates from the highlands of Beecroft Peninsula and discharges to the South Pacific Ocean. The flood study will focus on catchment, ocean and overland flooding within the Currarong area.

Millards Creek is centrally situated in Ulladulla. The flood study will focus on flooding within the Ulladulla/Milton area as well as flooding from a number of unnamed tributaries within the area.
