## Roads Grants

Shoalhaven City Council has been successful in receiving over \$3.645 million worth of road and asset grants assisting the area in creating a safe community.

Under the NSW Government Safer Roads Program 2018-2019 the following projects have been funded (exc GST):

- \$125,000 additional funding to complete the shoulder widening works on Bolong Road, east of Broughton Creek (a current project, nearing completion).
- \$130,000 to construct a single lane roundabout at the intersection of Illaroo Road and Page Avenue, North Nowra.
- \$145,000 to construct a channelised right turn treatment at the intersection of Jervis Bay Road and Gardner Road, Falls Creek.
- \$140,000 to construct a single lane roundabout at the intersection of Mitchell Parade and Donlan Road (south), Mollymook.
- \$190,000 for pedestrian crossing facilities (raised pedestrian crossings) on Jacobs Drive, Sussex Inlet.
- \$240,000 to construct a single lane roundabout at the intersection of Green Street and Warden Street, Ulladulla.



#### **Find Out More About Roadworks**

Under the NSW Government Saving Lives on Country Roads Program 2018/19 funding (exc GST) has been granted for:

- Funding for an upgrade to Sussex Inlet Road in the vicinity of Old Berrara Road
- \$590,000 for the shoulder widening and sealing on Greenwell Point Road to the east of Jindy Andy Lane.
- \$555,000 for the removal of the hazardous crest on Forest Road (to improve safety in one of the few overtaking zones on Forest Road).
- \$260,000 to extend the existing guardrail and install profile edge and centre lines over the 2.2km length of Naval College Road (to the south of The Wool Road).
- \$800,000 for the shoulder widening and sealing on Coonemia Road (the first 2km to the south of Culburra Road).

Duck Creek Bridge Opens

Bridge known as Duck Creek Bridge on Navel
College Road, Worrowing Heights on Tuesday,
31 July 2018.

The bridge renewal project managed by Council was funded under the Australian Government's Bridges Renewal Programme which provided \$750,000 towards the \$1.5 million project cost with Council providing matched funding.

"The Shoalhaven community is delighted to see the Moona Moona Creek Bridge open. With the support from the Roads to Recovery Program, we have been able to replace the two-lane timber bridge with a new concrete bridge, making it a safer and longer lasting bridge.

"There have been a number of accidents in this area and upgrading the bridge and road will stop the road being a hazard.

"We thank the federal government and Federal Member for Gilmore Ann Sudmalis for the funding support in ensuring we can continue to upgrade and renew the bridges in the Shoalhaven. The bridge replacement program not only supports rebuilding our infrastructure but is also a vital part of connecting our communities and villages," Mayor Amanda Findley.

#### **Watch a Council Meeting from Home**

What is an Ordinary Meeting? These meetings are the forum where the governing body conducts its core business. The General Manager is responsible for giving each councillor and the public at least three days' notice of the time and place of each meeting as well as the agenda and business papers for that meeting. In the Shoalhaven, we have monthly Ordinary Meetings and they are usually on the 4th Tuesday of the Month at 5pm.

These are supplemented by Extra Ordinary Meetings - Meetings of the Council which are called to deal with urgent issues.

### When can an Extra Ordinary Meeting be

**held?** Extraordinary meetings may be called on occasions to address business that cannot be postponed. Usually these require three (3) days' notice to be given, however is not required if the Extraordinary meeting is called in an emergency.
