Saturday, 29 September 2018 - Meet 9 am

White Sands Park Huskisson. Join an easy flat bike ride from Huskisson to Plantation Point. The ride is 12 km from White Sands Park, Huskisson where you meet at 9 am to ride to Plantation Point and return. On return, support a fundraising BBQ.

All registered participants receive a free Bike Safety Sample Bag. Free Face Painting from KELMC Artworks Face and Body Art.

Council has been successful in obtaining a Stronger Regional Communities Grant from the NSW Government to upgrade lighting at the Nowra Showground.

New lighting will be provided and electricity supply will be upgraded to ensure safer and easier access to power at major events.

Moss Vale Road Update

Council has adopted detailed planning controls for Moss Vale Road South Urban Release Area at the last Ordinary Meeting on 28 August 2018.

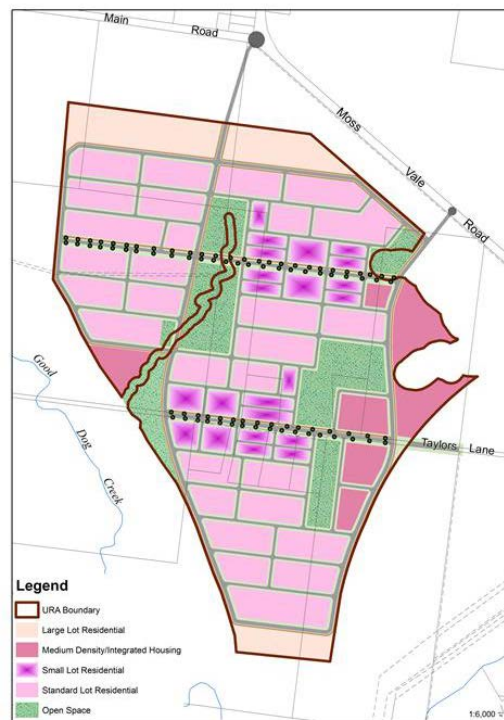
This is a significant milestone for the next growth phase in Nowra-Bomaderry's development as a key regional centre on the South Coast.

The Urban Release Area is one of six new living areas originally identified in the Nowra-Bomaderry Structure Plan and was zoned for new residential development when the Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan 2014 commenced. The Local Environmental Plan requires that more detailed planning controls and infrastructure requirements are put in place prior to the land being released for actual development.

Planning for growth in new areas such as Moss Vale Road South is important due to the increasing demand in the housing market, changing household trends and an ageing population. This new area will provide greater housing supply and choice in the market.

Through the detailed planning of each growth area, Council will encourage a range of lot sizes, housing types and densities to ensure that these new living developments meet the changing housing needs of the community.

Road Works

Berry - Victoria Street – Rehabilitation works will be undertaken from Queen Street to George Street and scheduled to commence 2 October 2018. During construction the affected area will be closed to all but residential traffic, with detours and traffic controls in place.

Bugong - Budgong Road - Gravel resheeting is scheduled for the week commencing 17 September 2018. The gravel resheeting is proposed for 1000m of Bundanon Road, between 1.0km and 3.0 km in from the Illaroo Rd intersection. Traffic flow will be maintained



Sanctuary Point - Paradise Beach Road and Kingsford Smith Crescent - Construction of a Roundabout. The project was delayed due to the discovery of unsuitable sub-grade, geotechnical investigations were conducted and the issue has been resolved. Access to

throughout the construction, however minor delays are to be expected.

Old Erowal Bay - The Wool Road - The Wool Road at Old Erowal Bay is scheduled for road repair and shoulder widening, with works to commence 17 September 2018

Kingsford Smith Crescent from Paradise Beach Road and visa-versa will be closed until mid-October. Detours are in place. Through traffic along Paradise Beach Road will be maintained under traffic control.
