

Level 1 Water Restrictions Started This Week

Be Water Wise

Shoalhaven residents start Level 1 Water Restrictions from 3 September 2018. Level 1 restrictions ban the washing down of hard surfaces such as paths and driveways and allows use of a hand-held hose at any time for gardening and lawn watering and washing of vehicles and boats. Sprinklers, drip irrigation and topping up of existing swimming pools can be used, but hoses must be connected to a timer.

Director of Shoalhaven Water, Carmel Krogh said, "Level One water restrictions are brought into place when our main water supply at Bamarang reduces to 60% capacity resulting in water having to be pumped from Danjera Dam to top up supplies."
