



Nowra CBD Access Improvement Grant Program Open

Council is accepting applications for funding under the Nowra CBD Access Improvement Grant Program. The grant program provides financial assistance of up to \$5,000 to undertake a range of improvements that enhance access into and around businesses.

Eligible projects include the construction or restoration of ramps and handrails at entry points, widening of doorways, modifications that result in improved access to bathroom facilities, counter heights and the installation of automatic doors.


Flying-foxes in the Shoalhaven

East Nowra Sub Arterial Road (ENSA)

The East Nowra Sub Arterial Road (ENSA) is proposed to connect Greenwell Point Road (in the vicinity of Old Southern Road) to the Princes Highway, at North Street and Junction Street. ENSA will provide a much needed alternative connection to the highway from the East Nowra, Worrigea and coastal village



areas. The link will relieve pressure along the Kalandar Street / Princes Highway route to the Nowra CBD.
