Flood Levee Works

Council is pleased with the works completed to date on the Shoalhaven River Levee Flood Damage Restoration Project.

The project has seen significant repairs to levee damage caused by the 2015 and 2016 East Coast Lows and defects identified during the Levee Audit conducted in May 2015. Weather permitting, the majority of the of works are schedule for completion in December 2018. Read more on Council's website.

Annual Community Survey Results

The annual phone survey, conducted by IRIS, uses a random sample of Shoalhaven's demographic makeup, to seek feedback on Council's performance.

The survey also assesses the community's overall well-being and feelings about their life and environment in general.

The Shoalhaven's Happiness Index was a score of 83.1, which is well above the national result of 75, it seems our community are happy with their life and with their well-being.
