### Anson Street Update -Legal Challenge to Planning Proposal



A separate legal challenge has been lodged in the NSW Land and Environment Court (L&EC) against the decision made by the NSW Minister for Planning to grant the initial Gateway approval for Planning Proposal PP023 in Anson Street, St Georges Basin to amend the Height of Buildings Map in the Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014.

The legal challenge was lodged on 22 December 2017, two days after the commencement of the exhibition of the planning proposal which ran from Wednesday, 20 December 2017 to Friday 2 February 2018.

This legal challenge was not publicised until after the completion of the exhibition, to avoid further complicating the planning proposal exhibition process, and confusing the community given the range of matters related to site that are currently ongoing.

An Explanatory Statement has been prepared to advise the public of the legal challenge to the Planning Proposal and of the basis of the challenge. It also details the undertaking made regarding this matter and how this will impact on the progress of the Planning Proposal.

#### **Road and Works Update**



Orient Point Third, Fourth and First
Streets - Construction of a footpath
on the Western side of these streets
is almost complete.

Jerrinja Estate – Full service pavement reconstruction will commence from 29 January 2018 and comprise full width road rehabilitation. The

South Nowra Albatross Road & Flinders Road Roundabouts - The works being undertaken at the primary roundabout at the Albatross Road and Flinders Road intersection include the completion of concrete median islands, crossings, access ramps, aprons, footpaths and AC on the roadway.

The primary roundabout is expected to be opened mid-February with through traffic on Albatross Road. The links onto the Albatross Service Road will remain in place for until the secondary roundabout is completed.

The secondary roundabout works linking Albatross Road, Albatross Service Road and Flinders Road will

reconstruction is expected to take around two weeks to complete. All roads will be closed during construction and residential access limited to foot traffic with a parking area to be initially completed in front of the medical centre.
