### **Bomaderry Pool Update**

Shoalhaven Community and Recreation
Precinct Status Report and Funding
Requests will yet again be a topic of debate
at the next Shoalhaven City Council
Ordinary Meeting.

A redesign of the masterplan to incorporate a 50-metre pool instead of 25-metre pool may impact funding and budget forecasts, meaning that some of the other enhancements and new facilities such as a crucial rehabilitation asset of a hydrotherapy pool will be lost.

Less than 10% of users of the Bomaderry

pool facility use the current aging 50-metre pool. The change to a 50-metre pool will cost the ratepayer an additional \$7.3 million in building the pool and annually, \$240,000. Read more here.

### Reclaimed Water Management Scheme update


Major upgrades to both the Nowra and Bomaderry wastewater treatment plants are underway as part of Shoalhaven Water's Reclaimed Water Management Scheme (REMS) 1B project.

A key element of the REMS 1B project is a pipeline (transfer main) under the Shoalhaven River supplying reclaimed water from the Bomaderry Wastewater Treatment Plant to the Nowra Wastewater Treatment Plant and REMS irrigation areas. Construction of this pipeline is subject to Council approval based on a review environmental factors, technical feasibility and costs.

Recent changes to the alignment and construction methods/hours of the proposed transfer main have required further assessments of environmental impacts.

An <u>addendum review of environmental</u> <u>factors (REF)</u> has been prepared and is currently available for public comment.

### **Roads and Works Update**



Road and assets projects are regularly updated on Council's <u>website</u>

Yellow Edge Lines installed across the Shoalhaven. Council will progressively roll out the use of unbroken yellow edge lines on the side of roads in the Shoalhaven that represent "No Stopping" zones.

The yellow lines will be installed across the City and will replace signage over the next few years.

Line marking has commenced in Mollymook and Huskisson.

Painted yellow lines are more durable, easier to maintain and have less impact on the visual appearance of an area than road signs. Roads and Maritime Services - NSW Road Rules introduced the option of lines rather than signs in 2008. "Rule 169 of the Road Rules (No Stopping on a road with a yellow edge line". Learn more.





