## Funding Support Appreciated

Shoalhaven City Council's Mayor has welcomed the announcement of funding from the Minister for Regional Development, Territories and Local Government John McVeigh and Federal Member for Gilmore Ann Sudmalis.

Council itself has received two grants from the Government's Regional Jobs and Investment Package for the design and construction of a new floating pontoon system at Greenwell Point for \$744,339 and at Woollamia for the construction of a boat maintenance facility totalling \$180,900 which will support marine tourism and the existing fleet. ## **Roads and Works Update**

Council appreciates that motorists who frequent Flinders Road and Albatross road Project Update Albatross Road & Flinders Road Roundabouts (as at 19/2/18) - The primary roundabout at the Albatross Road and Flinders Road intersection is expected to be opened this week with through traffic on Albatross Road.

Ulladulla Deering Street - Shared User Pathway Stage 1, the construction of approximately 340m of concrete pathway 2.5m wide. Works will commence at the Ulladulla Soccer Fields and continue towards the Lighthouse for approx. 340m. For further information please call 4429 8902.

St. Vincent and Church Streets – A roundabout is proposed at the intersection of St. Vincent and Church Streets. This area is network have been experiencing delays however the upgrades provide a critical link for industry and the improved link between Princes Highway and Albatross Road will greatly improve this network.

The \$6.75 Million upgrades is one of the most significant projects Council has undertaken on our local roads infrastructure and was made possible through a combination of Federal, State and Local funding. The project has experienced delays due to inclement weather and relocation of existing telecommunication, gas, water and electrical facilities, utilities and infrastructure to make way for the improvements. now closed for roundabout installation until mid-March. This project is being funded under the Federal Blackspot Program for 2016/17

Vincentia Plantation Point Reserve – A section of the carpark entry road is being reconstructed. Vehicular access will be restricted during working hours for up to 3 days.

There are a number of projects across the Shoalhaven. Dates are subject to change due to weather conditions, emergencies or other unforeseen interruptions.
