Name or type of plant	Maximum Height	Structural Role in the park vegetation	Number
Lomandra or Mat Rush	1m	Has a key role in soil stabilisation.	Plant 1m apart wherever possible on bank
Banksia	Less than 2m	Retain limited soil cover to prevent erosion	On request

## 12. SITE WEED LIST

Common Name	Extent	Control method used by group
Blackberry	Several small patches	Cut and paint or hand removal any remaining after spot spraying
Asparagus	Widespread both small and large	Cut out the crown using a knife or trowel. No need to remove the Liquid filled bolts underground
Bitou Bush	One small plant low down the gully	Pull out by hand
Montbrecia, orange flowering bulb	Widespread	Hand pull after rain, attempting to get all of the bulb out or dig with trowel. Try to pull all of the flowering bulbs.
Formosan the Lilly	Common	Hand pull or dig, making sure entire bulb is pulled
Cassia, the yellow flowering shrub	Very prolific and will be there for years	Hand pull smaller plants after rain or cut close to ground and paint with roundup.
Flowering	One plant deep in	Hard to get to. Hand pull or cut and

passionfruit	gully	paint.
Buffalo grass	Widespread on edge of mode area	Good to keep at this stage for its role in soil stabilisation. Best not to mow or brush cut at this stage.
