RECOVERY CENTRE

As of 9 March, we have had 1,388 people registered at the Ulladulla Recovery Centre. 79 people have registered in the last week. From the 16 March, Ulladulla Recovery Centre will operate from Thursday to Saturday with additional support being offered via Mobile Recovery Hubs.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Council attended the Regional Health and Wellbeing Subcommittee meeting with representatives from other affected LGAs, state and federal agencies working in the health and wellbeing space. Workshops focused on how a recovery support service case management model could be rolled out.

RECOVERY HUBS

Mobile Recovery Hubs started operation in Kangaroo Valley, Lake Conjola and Manyana. The hubs were supported by BlazeAid, Legal Aid, Bushfire Housing Assistance Program, Local Health District Mental Health team, Red Cross, Anglicare and more.

BRIDGE REPAIR

National Disaster Funding has now been approved for the reconstruction of Budgong Road Bridge over School Creek. A funding application for Yerriyong Bridge will be submitted this month.

DEVELOPMENT APPLICATIONS

Changes have been made to the Exempt and Complying Development Codes which enable any existing business that has sustained damage in the bushfires to operate from a portable office, such as a shipping container, for up to two years.

CLEAN UP

Laing O'Rourke met with property owners in Conjola Park last week with over 20 site meetings were conducted. It is anticipated clean up works start this week in the area.

SEDIMENT & EROSION CONTROL

With the assistance of Woollahra Municipal Council, 200 metres of coir logs for sediment control have been installed across 80 locations in Conjola Park and Lake Conjola. The coir logs protect the drainage lines and 60 stormwater inlets.

WILDLIFE RECOVERY

A new wildlife recovery newsletter has been put together by NSW National Parks & Wildlife Service. This edition looks at monitoring wildlife stations, the value of unburnt bushland and wildlife recovery stories.

WATER QUALITY

With ash, sediment and debris washed into our catchments, initial monitoring found lowering dissolved oxygen levels and increasing nitrogen levels, raising concerns. Regular monitoring is seeing levels return to normal, with our waterways and beaches continuing to be suitable for swimming.
