

Shoalhaven COVID-19 Safe Plan

Keeping the people of the Shoalhaven and visitors safe



Purpose:

- To identify risks and highlight actions to be taken to mitigate COVID-19 transmissions that may occur moving into the peak holiday season.
- To ensure that key stakeholders and partners have been consulted in the development of this action plan
- That identified mitigation strategies are aligned with current NSW Public Health Orders (<u>https://legislation.nsw.gov.au/information/covid19-legislation</u>)

Scope:

The Shoalhaven can expect increased tourism moving into the summer season. This is due to the lack of international travel being available and increased social awareness of the public following the promotion of our area to the general public. Public Health orders and restrictions which apply must be incorporated into each of the stakeholders' plans.



Handy Hints

- Keep a towel distance between yourself and other beachgoers
- Promote outdoor dining and mobile food trucks
- Avoid peak times, go earlier in the morning or later in the afternoon BEACHES
- Everyone has a role to play in controlling the spread of COVID-19 Do the right thing share the responsibility

Objectives:

- Maintain a minimal risk of COVID-19 transmission to the community and visitors
- Protect the community from an increased risk of contracting COVID-19
- Having an agreed action plan to reduce risk of COVID-19 transmissions.
- Support local businesses with economic revival
- Ensure preparedness by the Shoalhaven Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC) and Shoalhaven City Council

Communications:


Shoalhaven Council will provide timely and accurate communications across a range of channels. This includes digital, website, social, print signage and any other platforms that will increase the effective engagement of the community in key messaging including Variable Messaging Boards.

All communications will be in line with NSW Health Orders and relevant authorities.

Council will align messaging with other agencies communications through a process of collaboration.

Council's Continuity Management Team will meet as required to ensure internal stakeholders response as required and in consultation with the LEMC.


COVID-19 Safe Plan - Shoalhaven

Shoalhaven Council established a Continuity Management Team to coordinate Council's response to the Pandemic. Council also continues to work closely with the Local Emergency Management Committee made up of representatives from the local emergency services and NSW Health.

Handy Hints

- The 4 square metre rule helps to determine the maximum number of people who can be on a premises. It does not determine the distance between people.
- Physical distancing means reducing the close physical contact we have with people and staying 1.5 metres away from people we don't live with.
