Thank you for your email. Apologies that we did not connect through your calls.

By way of an update, the administration, financial management (including procurement) and oversight of all contracted projects, previously managed and overseen by the Waste Services Department, specifically the Waste Services Manager and their direct report, the Project Manager (Waste Services), has now been removed from their responsibility and allocated to the Projects and Contracts Adviser in the Technical Services Department of the Council, overseen by the Manager Technical Services and reporting to the Director City Services.

Additionally, Council's Executive Management Team (EMT) has now endorsed the creation of an Enterprise Project Management Office (ePMO), with the purpose of mitigating risks for the organisation covering all project management phases from pre-procurement to project delivery. The ePMO will be the responsibility of the Director City Services and it will report directly the EMT. The ePMO is considered a robust governance framework which includes clear delegations for infrastructure Project Managers and will underpin Council's ongoing commitment to effective and efficient capital project administration.
