Introduction



This report provides a summary of external stakeholder survey responses provided as part of a Shoalhaven City Council Community Infrastructure Audit 2024 (Community Infrastructure Audit / Audit).

The Audit included targeted stakeholder and community engagement activities to gauge utilisation and customer satisfaction data for a range of sites. The Audit engagement activity was undertaken from 22 May – 12 June 2024.

The Community Infrastructure Audit was prepared by Xypher Sport + Leisure in close collaboration with Shoalhaven City Council's (Council's) Open Space & Planning Team and Asset Management Advisors.

The Audit provides a key base of evidence for the review of Council's *Community Infrastructure Strategic Plan 2017-2036* (CISP) by collating and presenting data on the provision, condition and use of open space and community facilities.

A summary of the outcomes of the external stakeholder engagement activity is provided in this report. Summaries of the outcomes of the associated community, management committee and tenant engagement activities are provided in separate reports published to the CISP Review Get Involved page on Council's website.

About the Stakeholder Engagement Activity



As a component of the Community Infrastructure Audit, identified external stakeholders were invited to complete surveys for a selection of 25 sample sites.

Invitations to participate in the survey were issued via direct email to 321 stakeholders, including to community and sporting groups who regularly hire one of the 25 sites.

Responses were received for 22 out of the 25 sites, with a total of 105 responses received.

The 25 sample sites were identified as facilities where more information was required to guide recommendations in the revised CISP. The selected sites are a representative mix of community buildings, sporting facilities, pools, parks and reserves from across the Shoalhaven Local Government Area and are listed below.










Usage - Hours p/week
