Long – Leaf willow primrose (*Ludwigia longifolia*).



Description

Long-leaf willow primrose is an upright annual shrub up to 3 m tall that grows in wet areas and in water. Leaves are alternate on the stem, 10-20 cm long and 0.5-2.5 cm wide stalkless and are larger lower down and smaller higher up the stem.

Flowers are yellow with 4 (or rarely 5) petals each 2.0-2.5 cm long and 4 red or green sepals. Single flowers in the junctions of upper leaves and are present from summer-winter.

Seedpods are 1-4 cm long and 4-8 mm wide, oblong to narrow-oblong and 4-angled with lots of seeds in separate chambers.

Seeds are brown to yellow less than 1 mm long, abundant, and dust-like.

Stems are red or greenish, narrow, and square shaped often with winged edges and usually branching towards the top.

Roots are shallow and fibrous.

To Eradicate from the Shoalhaven.
