

# WANTED

## Boneseed (*Chrysanthemoides monilifera* subsp.)



### Description

Boneseed is an erect, woody, perennial shrub which grows up to 3 m high. Leaves are oval shaped with irregular toothed edges 3-9 cm long, covered with white hairs when young and hairless when mature. Leave alternate along the stem. Flowers are yellow daisy-like flowers with 4-8 petals up to 3 cm in diameter in clusters at the end of the branches. Flowers are mostly present from late winter to mid-spring. Fruit is round, green and fleshy when young, black when mature. The fruit is 6-8 mm in diameter with a single seed. Seeds are whitish, bone-coloured when dry, smooth, and round. Stems are woody, and branched upright.

### Goal

To Eradicate from the Shoalhaven.

### Whereabouts

Last seen Lake Conjola, Narrawallee, Mollymook and South Nowra. Found in open woodlands, dunes and heathland.
