

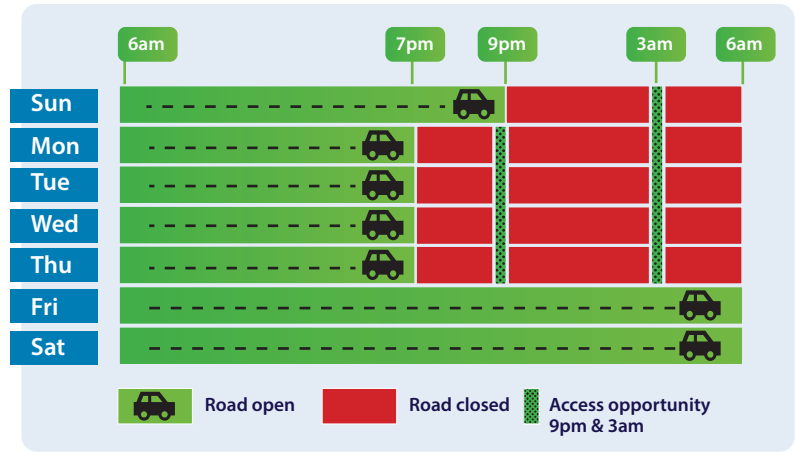
Burrier Road - increased access during night works

Night works at 130 Burrier Road begin on Sunday 3 September and will take around six weeks to complete.

Following feedback from the community, new access times have been built into the schedule to allow greater flexibility for residents. This includes:

- Extension of opening times to:
 - 9pm on Sundays
 - 7pm Monday – Thursday.
- Two windows for vehicles to pass through the work site at 9pm and 3am. Site work will halt to allow access to vehicles waiting at this time.

The shuttle service will continue to operate to facilitate access during all closure times.



Updated schedule

Works will stop at 9pm and 3am to allow vehicles to travel through the site under traffic control.

Emergency services

Combat agencies including police, ambulance, SES and RFS have put measures in place with the contractor, Symal, to ensure quick access and safe passage for any emergency vehicles.

Symal has emergency protocols for site management and the risk plan can be found on the Burrier Road project page on the Council website.

In an emergency, dial '000' to trigger the emergency response process with advanced notice.

Shuttle service FAQ

How many passengers can be transported in the shuttle service at once?

Our vehicle is an 8-seater van which means we can take up to 7 people.

Are there child restraints?

Yes, our vans will have child restraints.

Is there room for stock feed, school bags and luggage?

The vans have enough space to transport large quantities of luggage and up to 80kg of feed if required. We'll also have a ute available to assist if needed.

Is the vehicle regularly cleaned to ensure good hygiene protection against COVID19?

Absolutely, the vehicle will be regularly cleaned to ensure it's a clean space for residents.

Can the vehicle go to the door of properties that have difficult terrain?

Yes, we will have a 4wd ute at site to access those hard to reach properties without problem.

Will we have to walk through the worksite?

Yes, people will be escorted the short distance through the site by the traffic controller to ensure your safety.

Emergency management

Emergency communication centres have been provided with contact numbers for onsite managers to open the road to allow access when a resident dials '000'.

Symal have site protocols if fire alerts are triggered and will be instructed by NSW Rural Fire Service to provide access in case of an emergency.

If a resident arrives at the site requiring medical assistance, Symal will contact emergency services and render assistance until paramedics arrive.

Symal have an automated external defibrillator (AED) onsite as part of its standard operations.
