DANJERA DAM FACILITIES UPGRADE – STAGE 1 WORKS – ACCESS ROAD/ PARKING AREA/ PICNIC SHELTERS PROJECT – 74644E

Dear Sir/Madam

Shoalhaven City Council advised in October 2023 that the access road to the Dajera Dam recreational area would need to close to complete stage 1 of the upgrades at this site.

Council committed to reviewing this temporary closure in the hope of allowing access short term to the Dam recreation area over the school holiday period.

The recent storm events and localised flooding has damaged the access road cutting off safe access to the Dam recreation area. Council will be working to repair the access road so that work can continue on stage 1 of the project.

Because of the damage to the dam access road and the school holidays commencing very soon, it will not be possible to allow short term access to the site for the school holiday period.

The project, involves significant improvements to the recreational area, including widening the access road, landscaping enhancements, and the addition of new picnic shelters, car and trailer parking areas, and signage.

While the closure is regrettable, Shoalhaven City Council emphasizes the importance of completing the works as scheduled to ensure the long-term safety and enjoyment of the facility for all visitors.

Council acknowledges the inconvenience caused by the closure and apologizes for any disruption to residents and visitors. Council remains committed to keeping the community informed of project progress and will provide updates as they become available.
