

Silage Wrap Recycling

Shoalhaven City Council, in partnership with Plastic Forests, is accepting silage wrap from local farmers for recycling, at no charge.

Instead of this single-use packaging ending up in landfill, it can now be recycled into new plastic agricultural products such as fencing posts, square pickets and poly sheets.

It's another way, your Council is actively finding practical solutions to participate in the circular economy.

How does it work?

Step 1 - Prepare

- Silage Wrap can only be accepted when it is packed in a 'Plastic Forest' UV stable plastic bag.
- These bags can be collected from
 - NSW Local Land Services: 13 Schofields Lane BERRY
 - Council's Recycling & Waste Depots



Step 2 - Collection

- Twine and wrap must be collected in separate bags.
Do not mix twine and silage wrap in the same bag.
- Shake off dirt & moisture before bagging. A little hay is OK, but no rocks, steel, dirt or dead furry animals!
- Full bags must be tied off with PP twine or a cable tie if desired – do not use wire!
- Keep silage wrap & bags DRY – undercover if possible

Step 3 - Delivery

- Load bags of silage wrap into your vehicle. Ensure that it is easily identifiable from any other part of your load.
- Please go through the gate at all Depots and inform staff of your silage wrap/twine load and follow their instructions.
