## World Environment Day Fair in Huskisson

Shoalhaven City Council's Waste Services, Environmental Services and Tapstar [with his Drippettes] will be on hand for the World Environment Day Fair at the Lady Denman Heritage Complex Huskisson on Saturday 5 June 2010.

Council is supporting World Environment Day Fair with several groups from Council providing advice and information at the day.

Council will be joined by other community groups providing advice on areas such as gardening, Australian plants, wind and solar power, LED lighting, water and garden conservation, motor scooters, bicycles, chooks, recycling mobile phones. The day will also see a market stalls and local entertainers.
