Since the bushfires were declared extinguished, 50 Shoalhaven properties have begun the process of being cleared. By the time you read this, more than 420 site inspections and another 390 deeds of work have been signed for clean-up.

I know there are landowners whose circumstances may not fall easily within the scope of work and need further review and assessment. Sanitiser for essential services

Greg Pullen, Council's Economic Development Manager, has been instrumental in connecting the Manildra Group with local health services, schools and nursing homes needing hand sanitiser, which has been in short supply.

The company have now produced 1000 litre quantities of ethanol hand sanitiser to a network of distributors, to help supply the community. Many health services have been given 20 litres for free.

Mr. Pullen approached the Flagstaff Group, at Unanderra and Yumaro at Moruya, to be distributors and is now working on a similar service in the Southern Highlands and Southern Sydney areas.

Council campgrounds are closed



The community is reminded that all Council Campgrounds are now closed for visitors due to COVID-19 restrictions. Residents should only leave home for essential purposes.

This reminder comes after Rangers recently located multiple campers and recreational users in the Yalwal Campground area. Rangers have increased patrols of the area, issuing on the spot infringement notices to those found in the camping grounds for not adhering to road closure signs. Local Police are also patrolling daily to ensure the *Public Health Act* is being adhered to.
