#### Small Business Support Grants

Shoalhaven successfully applied for 2,582 bushfire grants under the NSW Government scheme.

In the last week Council processed 1,600 tonnes of waste from bushfire demolition, bringing the total waste processed to nearly 9,000 tonnes from 89 houses.

The clean-up is progressing well with 102 sites cleaned to date. Significant work continues to match fire destroyed property with registered owners for clean-up. Communicating with registered owners through Service NSW, Shoalhaven City Council and personal contact have all been successful in the main, however we still have properties whose owners are not registered in Sassafras, Budgong, Wandandian and Nerriga. Formal submissions by Shoalhaven City Council and Shoalhaven Water have been accepted by the NSW Independent Bushfire Inquiry. The Council submission to the Royal Commission is underway and will be ready for the revised early May deadline.

Whilst we can't promote physical visits to our region, Shoalhaven Tourism's 'Spend Here This Year' Campaign is helping business adapt to sell online or over the phone to locals and markets further afield.

#### **Built Recovery**

**Local Land Services Grant** - The NSW Government has passed regulations which allows full or partial exemptions for the Long Service Levy, specifically for the NSW Bushfires. Exemptions are for the replacement or repair of buildings destroyed or damaged as a result of the bushfires from 1 July 2019 - 2 March 2020.

A Long Service Levy on these builds is not payable in respect of the first \$1million (incl. of GST) of the costs of erecting a building. Applications must be submitted prior to 2 March 2023. Full details are available at bit.ly/2RRSs4j

#### **Council's Bereavement Services**

As many services close, our Bereavement Services Team are still working to ensure your loved one receives the send-off they deserve.

The team understand the current restrictions are hard on family members, with many family and friends unable to attend and celebrate a loved one's life. Bereavement Services is offering grieving families a private YouTube link with a full recording of the funeral service. This link can then be shared across the globe with family and friends allowing them to also say their goodbyes.



#### **Small Business Support**

The NSW Government are providing Small Business Grants to support businesses impacted by COVID-19. Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to small businesses, not-for-profit organisations and sole traders.

You may be eligible if your organisation has experienced a significant decline in revenue as a direct result of COVID-19. The funds may be used for unavoidable business expenses such as utilities, Council rates, telecommunication charges, insurance payments, franchise fees and paying creditors.
