A Word From Vince

Council's call back service continues to contact the 1,488 bushfire affected residents who registered with Council. The Recovery Helpline and Council front desk Customer Service Team has done extraordinary work contacting two thirds of all registrants to date. The feedback is positive, and Council was able to redirect or refer customers to the right places to have their concerns addressed.

The clean-up of our City is nearly complete and Laing O'Rourke's presence in the Shoalhaven is rapidly drawing to a close. Of the 424 eligible properties for the Government funded clean-up, more than 392 properties have been cleaned and debris removed. The specially built non-contaminated waste management area at West Nowra completed its designated task and has been decommissioned. Of almost 18,000 tonnes of waste accepted and recycled, only approx. 380 tonnes was placed in landfill. This is an extraordinary result with over 93% of non-contaminated waste being repurposed or recycled.

Shoalhaven Recovery is in a very good place to transition from Recovery to Council business as usual by 30 June. Regrettably COVID-19 is still with us and needs our ongoing collective attention. Stay well and safe.

Our West Nowra processing plant is completing the final processing of non-contaminated waste with a total of 17,797 tonnes cleared, 7,946 in the processing stockpile for recycling. To date 93% has been recycled into other purposes and 250 tonnes to landfill.
