



Southern Headlands Walk

The 20km Southern Headlands Walk connects Narrawallee Inlet to Blackburn Head at Burrill Lake.

It combines a variety of landscapes, linking 10 beaches, quiet back streets, cafes, and headland walks, all marked with interpretive signage and wayfinding. Follow the Banksia symbols on the trail markers to guide you along the route.

Walking Tips

- Beaches:** tides can impact access to some beaches
- use alternative routes if necessary.
- Cliffs:** parts of the walk are along unprotected cliffs so take care and supervise children.
- Footpaths:** be mindful of traffic when walking on sections of road without footpaths.
- Split the walk:** you can explore in short sections to suit your walking ability.
- Full walk:** Those doing the full 20km walk are advised to do a 'car shuffle', or check out local bus timetables.
- Travel smart:** Wear appropriate shoes, carry water, a phone, and wear sun protection.
- Dogs:** dogs on leads are welcome for most of the walk, but are not permitted on some beaches. Refer to signage or visit Shoalhaven Council's website dog friendly beaches.
- Toilets:** Public toilets are located throughout the route.

Parking

There is parking at Narrawallee Inlet and Blackburn Headland and throughout the route. Parking at Blackburn Headland, Burrill Lake, is off the busy Princes Highway so be careful when entering and exiting the informal parking area.
